
## San Antonio Wolf Trap Artists

tions in performing arts education as an Assis-


tant Director, Vocal Director, Choreographer,

Stage Manager, and Teaching Artist.




Art Form: Puppetry

A highlight during this time was performing a show for Heather Henson and her mother at the Puppet Slam Festival. Austin now travels across the country with his wife (Air Force) connecting with different puppet guilds and puppeteers. From time to time he still goes to Orlando to perform in the Puppet Slams and has had the chance to meet Leslie Carrara-Rudolph. Austin started his own puppet troupe and company to educate children and adults about the joy of puppetry and the various puppet art forms. Crosstitch Productions has allowed Austin to continue to educate others in the art form of puppetry, techniques, and how to fabricate puppets. Austin is currently working on a project to do puppet shows for Syrian, and South-Asian refugees.



In San Antonio, in addition to 4 years with SA Wolf Trap, she has worked with Classic Theatre in their education program and with Magik Theatre as Puppet Designer and Choreographer as well as actor. In teaching, Katrin encourages integrating different art forms with other subjects demonstrating that art, history, science etc. interrelate. Tiffany Harmon is the owner of Kathy Marfin's

Dance School and the Director of The Leading Edge Dance Company, a pre-professional performance and competition team formed from the students at Kathy Marfin's Dance School. She teaches and choreographs all ages and styles, including Jazz, Tap, Musical Theater, Lyrical, Contemporary, Hiphop, Acro/ Tumbling, Cheer/Pom, and Ballet. She firmly believes in attending as many workshops, intensive and conventions as possible, with her, her staff and her students attending two to four conventions a year, including Texas Association Teachers of Dancing, Tremaine, JUMP, DanceMakers Inc, Third Coast Rhythm Project, Joffrey Ballet Summer Programs, Rockettes Summer Intensive, Ailey Summer Intensive and many more. Her choreography and routines have won numerous distinguished awards including IDE Outstanding Performance "Best in Tap", two Al Gilbert awards, Video of the Year Finalist, SDA Regional Champion, "Better than Broadway" award, 4 times Golden Ticket Highest Scoring routine, Tap Excellence award, as well as three Entertainment Awards and three Best Choreography awards. Tiffany is active in all areas of Dance and Tumbling; she is a member of the Teacher Advisory Panel for Discount Dance Supply and Theatricals Costumes, a member of San Antonio Dance Umbrella, a member of International Tap Association, a two year Co. Dance Teachers Program certified teacher, a Certified Instructor through USA Gymnastics, a Certified Instructor through Acrobatic Arts, a Sponsor of National Honor Society of Dance Arts, and a Certified Instructor through Texas



Association Teachers of Dancing.

Gregory Messa has played percussion as a

soloist and with groups across the USA. As a freelancer, he has performed regularly with many groups including Symphony Silicon Valley, Opera San Jose, Monterey County Symphony Orchestra, Santa Cruz Symphony, The Oakland Municipal Band, the Cabrillo Festival of Contemporary Music, and more. including a Bachelor's Degree in Music Per-



As a devoted music educator, Greg teaches classes and lessons online at West Valley College, including founding and directing the West Valley College Percussion Ensemble and teaches private lessons locally in San Antonio, Texas.

Art Form: Theatre


